


BRAZEN: REBEL LADIES WHO ROCKED THE WORLD

32	She makes communist friends there. She meets a young idealist named Pericles Franco, the future founder of the popular Socialist Party.
35	They are locked up and tortured in the notorious La Cuarenta prison.
	The illustration on the top middle of the page depicts three unkempt, shirtless women shown from behind. They all have several red lines slashed across their backs.

104	The illustration on the middle-right of the page depicts two women running past another woman lying on the ground with blood pooling around her head. There are bullets flying in the air past the two woman running.
105	One day, he starts hitting her. Leymah decides to leave him, but life chooses that very moment to throw her a little curveballThe baby does very little to bring out Daniel's softer side. He beats Leymah even harder and rapes her on a regular basis.
	The illustration on the middle of the page depicts a woman kneeling with her head in a bucket. She has blackened and reddened spots all over her body. The woman is stepping over dead man lying on the ground and there are holes in a wall behind her surrounded by red splatters. The illustration on the bottom-left side of the page depicts a woman with a torn dress, on her knees praying. She is crying and has blacked splotches all over her body.

But as it turns out, this isn't the caseHaving to wear boys' clothes is torture for her, and she secretly puts on her sister's pretty dressesAs a teen, she quickly becomes very jealous of her best friend. Or rather, jealous of his girlfriends. George keeps to herself.
125	She tells him everything: Her despair, the sexual "no man's land" between genders in which she feels like she is dying, and her conviction that what others see isn't her true self"You have the sexual features of a boy. You were registered as a boy." "But it does look like somewhere in there, you're a woman, that's all." George then agrees to become Dr. Hamburger's guinea pig and embarks on an intense three-year hormone therapyUnder close monitoring from the doc and a shrink, George watches her body and face transform. She learns to modify her voiceThe doc then suggests a surgery. The result: her body will stop producing male hormones. This requires the authorization of the Danish Minister of Justice.
126	The operation is performed, but George wants official recognition. So she meets with the U.S. Ambassador and asks him to change her passport and her first nameGeorge has always been a woman, but now Christine is a woman in the eyes of everybody else. Her new name changes her life.

127	Nobody is 100% "man" or 100% "woman""Do you get periods?" "Did you keep that little bit the surgeon chopped off as a memento?"		
128	Stories on the brave, glamorous woman stop selling, so the press changes its angle, turning mean (and dumb): "transvestite," "degenerate," etc. Magazines start to use the pronoun "he" to refer to Christine. As it turns out, society has a hard time accepting the spectrum of identities between "man" and "woman." They argue that her contract is void because "she" is really a "he."		
139	"Plus, she slept her way to the top!"		
157	She comes from a very large family in which girls are considered a financial burden. Her father is much older than her mother, who was only twelve when they were married.		
	(She called him "Uncle" at the time.) Since war broke out in 1979, women have lost much of their freedom. The Taliban are now in power, and they enforce their own severe interpretation of Sharia law. She loses her father at the age of nine. Shortly after, her mother announces she has found Sonita a husbandAlthough the legal age is sixteen and forced marriage is forbidden in Islam, many Afghan girls are married off by their parents at a much younger age.

	This little girl realizes something for the first time: she's viewed as merchandise.		
159	Like all girls, I am caged. I am a sheep raised only for slaughterSome of the girls are bruised. Others become pregnant, even though they're still children. Others just disappearBut one day, her brother bursts into her room: he's decided to take her back to Afghanistan and marry her off. She's sixteen, and he wants to sell her.		
169	But when she hits her teens, he suddenly takes an interest in Cheryl. A little too much. Way too much. She liked it better when he acted as if she didn't exist. She liked it better when she was invisible.

194	As for the lyrics, no more filter: she sings about herself, about the difficulties becoming an adult, about prostitution, and kinky sex.

	The illustration on the bottom-right-side of the page depicts an arm lying in a pool of blood.	
286	She leaves Laurence for literary critic John Holms, whom she finds fascinating (and who's a boozehound)John dies under anesthesia. (He was drunk.) Peggy mourns him in the shoulders of (lots of) new lovers.	
287	(He also introduces her to Samuel Beckett, who is just Peggy's type.) They'll go on to have a toxic love affair that lasts for ages.	
288	She usually sleeps with them, as well. (Which doesn't stop her from supporting their wives.)	
	The illustration on the top-right-side of the page depicts a woman shouting while holding onto canvases on the ground. The text above the illustration reads: But then the Nazis invade Paris. Peggy is Jewish, she has children, and yet she has only ONE fear: My babies! They'll destroy my babies!!!
