	The illustration on this page depicts a young boy and girl standing up with their internal and external organs shown.
	The illustrations on this page depict nude males and females from various ages from baby to older grownup. <i>See Figure 1</i> .
14	The illustration on this page depicts 3 females holding up windows over their pelvis, showing their internal organs. The very young girl is depicted nude from the waist downward.
15	The illustration on the bottom of the page depicts a closeup of a vulva with the labels: Opening to the urethra, Labia, Opening to the Vagina, Labia, Clitoris
16	The illustration on this page depicts 3 males holding up windows over their pelvis, showing their internal organs. The very young boy is depicted nude from the waist downward.

24	Sometimes the penis becomes stiff and larger, and stands out from the body. This is called "having an erection." After puberty begins, semen can- but does not always- come out the tip of the penis during an "ejaculation."

25	The illustration on the middle of the page depicts a zoomed in view of a penis and scrotum with the internal structures depicted and labeled.
26	There's a good chance you know that making a baby has something to do with sex. But you may not know exactly what sex is.
28	When a woman and a man want to make a baby, they hug and cuddle and kiss and feel very loving, and get very close to each other- so close that a man's penis goes inside the woman's vagina. When this happens, it is called "sexual intercourse."
	During sexual intercourse, millions of tiny sperm swim from the man's penis into the woman's vagina.
	The illustration on the middle of the page depicts a woman lying on her back on a bed while a man lies on top of her. The man is kissing her cheek and there are hearts floating around their heads. <i>See Figure 2</i> .
29	Some people call sexual intercourse "sex" or "having sex." When people grow up, having sex is one way to show their love for each other. That's why some people call sexual intercourse "making love."
31	You may have heard the words "straight," "gay," and "lesbian."You may have also heard the words "heterosexual" and "homosexual."



Page	Content	
	Here's what the words "heterosexual" and "homosexual" mean. A female and a male who are sexually attracted to and who may fall in love with each other are called "heterosexual." A heterosexual person is sexually attracted-like a magnet- to the other sex or gender. A female who is sexually attracted to and who may fall in love with another female is called "homosexual." A male who is sexually attracted to and who may fall in love with another male is also called "homosexual." A homosexual person is sexually attracted- like a magnet- to the same sex or gender. The word "straight" is another name for a heterosexual male or female. The word "gay" is another name for a homosexual male or female. And the word "lesbian" is another name for a homosexual female.	
38	And that's when some people use ways other than sexual intercourse for an egg cell and a sperm cell to meet. In fact, scientists have figured out several ways for an egg and a sperm cell to meet. Doctors can place sperm into the vagina or the uterus with a syringe- a tube like an eyedropper.	
39	There are many kinds of birth control. One kind is a pill a woman can take. These pills can keep the ovaries from sending out an egg. A "condom" is another kind of birth control. A condom fits over the penis and can catch sperm before it can meet the egg. A condom can also keep people from getting or passing on infections like HIV- the infection that causes AIDS- during sexual intercourse.	
69	Touching or rubbing the private parts of your own body because it feels good is called "masturbation." Some people also call masturbation "playing with yourself." Many people masturbate. Many don'tSome people and some religions think it's wrong to masturbate. But most doctors agree that masturbation is perfectly healthy and perfectly normal- and cannot hurt you or your body.	






